IMPORTANT DISMISSAL INFORMATION

Car Riders

Dear Parents,

Your child's safety at school is our number one priority. Please review the following two points that will help us keep your child safe when dismissing by car:

*All parents who pick up their child by car as the primary means of transportation must display the school car rider tag every day when picking up their child. If you have lost your card, please inform the car duty personnel that you need a replacement. It is imperative that you display this card at pick up. Car duty personnel need to be able to see your card every day at dismissal.

*If your child is not normally a car rider but you call the school or send in a note to request that he or she ride home by car, we are going to hold the student in the office for pick up. We will need to see ID and check the emergency card prior to releasing your child. We know this may not be as convenient as coming through the car loop, but it will ensure the safety of your child.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

This is a review of the general guidelines for administering medication at school for all Pasco County Public Schools:

- 1.) Administration of medication during school hours should occur only when medication schedules cannot be adjusted to provide for administration at home.
- 2.) Medication will be administered by personnel trained by the registered school nurse or other medical professional as permitted by law. No narcotic analgesic medications will be administered at school.
- 3.) Medication must be brought in to school by the parent in the **original prescription container** with the **original prescription label** containing the following information:
- Student's name
- Name of medication (no herbal medications)
- Dosage prescribed
- Time of day to be taken
- Physician's name
- Special instructions
- Date of prescription (current, within one year)
- 4.) No more than a month's supply of medication should be brought to school at one time. Medication received will be counted. The amount and date received will be recorded on a *Student Medication Administration Record*.
- 5.] An *Authorization for Medication Administration* form must be completed by the parent. Parent and healthcare provider authorization for the administration of medications and treatments is required annually.
- 6.] Regulated, non-prescription medication will not be administered at school unless accompanied by a physician's statement, dated within the current school year. All over-the-counter medication must be brought to school in the **original**, **unopened** container.
- 7.] Students are allowed to carry metered dose asthma inhalers, pancreatic enzyme supplements, epinephrine auto-injectors, or diabetic supplies, medication and equipment with written authorization from their parent and physician.
- 8.) It is preferred that a parent obtain a needed dose(s) of medication for a field trip in a separate, appropriately labeled prescription container.
 - All medications must be removed from the school premises one week after the expiration date, upon appropriate notification of medication being discontinued or at the end of the school year. Unused and unclaimed medication will be destroyed.
